⁹ It will be said on that day,


"See, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us.






*GATHERING SONG (ELW 241) O Lord, How Shall I Meet You







FIRST READING:

A reading from Jeremiah 33. (Sermon text) While the prophet Isaiah is the most quoted prophet in the New Testament and well-known for his beautiful Messianic prophecies, we should not neglect the poetic hopeful works of the weeping prophet, Jeremiah.

Thus says the Lord: In this place of which you say, "It is a waste without humans or animals," in the towns of Judah and the streets of Jerusalem that are desolate, without inhabitants, human or animal, there shall once more be heard the voice of mirth and the voice of gladness, the voice of the bridegroom and the voice of the bride, the voices of those who sing as they bring thank offerings to the house of the Lord:

"Give thanks to the Lord of hosts,

for the Lord is good,

for his steadfast love endures forever!"

For I will restore the fortunes of the land as at first, says the Lord.

Thus says the Lord of hosts: In this place that is waste, without humans or animals, and in all its towns there shall again be pasture for shepherds resting their flocks. In the towns of the hill country, of the Shephelah, and of the Negeb, in the land of Benjamin, the places around Jerusalem, and in the towns of Judah, flocks shall again pass under the hands of the one who counts them, says the Lord.

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: "The Lord is our righteousness." The word of the Lord.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9


A reading from 1 Corinthians.
