








HOLIDAY BAZAAR

April 14, 2025

Council meetings are open and everyone is invited to attend.

The Executive Board met to plan the agenda on Sunday, April 13, 2025.

Call to Order at 7:00 pm

Pastor Ellen Krich opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes

A motion to approve the March minutes was made by Michael Schumann and seconded by Andrea Zahirsky; the motion was passed. A copy of the minutes will be published in the next *Oakleaf*.

Asset Account - Phil Biedronski

Phil Biedronski provided the Morgan Stanley Investment Account summary of activity for the month ending March 31, 2025. Our combined asset accounts lost \$286 in March; our investments did better than the stock indexes. Our account balance stood at \$546,778 on 3/31/2025.

Status of Funds - Helen Tennant

- The March 2025 Profit and Loss report indicated that our income fell short of our expenses by \$1,071.68.
- George Warren's IRA (<\$300) still to come; ~\$50,000 from Nancy Kohlman's estate is also pending.
- Helen Tennant made a motion to pay Barbara Skillman an additional \$50 per week when she is holding choir practice as well as playing the organ. Mike Schumann seconded the motion; the motion passed.
- Helen Tennant made a motion to pay Tate Armstrong \$500 per pay period (every two weeks) vs. \$500 monthly during his deployment. Howard Stansbury seconded the motion; the motion passed.

Pastor's Report

- Pastor Ellen will lead Jim Umerley's memorial service on Wednesday, April 16.
- Pastor Ellen would like to provide a Sunday 3 p.m. service at the Resorts of Augsburg (formerly Augsburg Lutheran Home) sometime in the fall after Tate returns.
- Still need members to attend the Synod Assembly (possibly Linda McMahon).
- Noisy change offering will be collected in May leading up to the assembly.
- Joan Ruzicka and Melissa O'Donnell wish to become members of our congregation. Sandy Petrovich made a motion to approve their membership; Ugonnaya Obineme seconded the motion, and it was approved by all. They will be taken in on Sunday, May 4th.
- Deacon Shelly will preach on the last Sunday in April, and Doug Meekins will speak on May 4th as part of our stewardship program.
- Need a pictorial directory of members to help us know one another. Will get a committee together to investigate whether a photo studio or self-publishing is best.

Old Business

CLAIM Membership

Ugonnaya Obineme made a motion for Christus Victor to join CLAIM (Coalition of Lutherans Advancing in Mission). Linda McMahon seconded the motion; a majority approved, and the motion passed.

Outstanding Projects

- Mike Schumann took Pastor Ellen's official photo and will work on framing it.
- Linda McMahon is framing the photo of the church taken by Bob Heyman.
- Pastor Ellen will form a committee to organize the records of the scattering garden.
- Painting by Nick Zahirsky (altar room; sanctuary and fellowship hall touchups) has been delayed but happening soon.
- Refinishing of tiled floors was completed by Higher Standard Carpet Cleaning. Will find a company that handles commercial properties next time.
- Narthex bathrooms need renovation. Howard Stansbury will work with a committee to get estimates.
- Need a tutorial so all council members can successfully program the fellowship hall door to remain unlocked and then
 relock it.

Property Report

- On April 5, the CPR/AED/choking/Narcan training for certification was well attended.
- A new landscaping company, Rodriguez Lawncare & Landscaping, has been hired to do the grass cutting and tree/shrub maintenance.
- On April 28, BGE will replace the fluorescent lighting throughout the buildings with more efficient LED lights at no cost to Christus Victor.

New Business

- Medical equipment that has been piling up under the coat rack in the narthex will be reduced to one wheelchair and one
 walker. Other items will be donated to LMS.
- Howard Stansbury will purchase a new first aid kit for the narthex.
- Sandy Petrovich made a motion to move the church picnic from June 1 to June 8; Mike Schumann seconded the motion, and all approved. There will not be a First Sunday Social in June; the picnic will serve as the monthly social.
- Sandy Petrovich made a motion to move the Faith, Fellowship and Fun Team from under the umbrella of the Fellowship Team to Social Ministry. Ugonnaya Obineme seconded the motion, and it was passed.
- Sandy Petrovich proposed having a structure built to hold special event signs to avoid the issues of the vinyl signs sagging and falling off the wall---To be investigated further.
- Sandy will box up choir robes and move acolyte robes to the choir room, freeing up space the Scouts can use that is out of sight. She will also dispose of Walk with Jesus supplies.

Social Ministry

Helen Tennant made a motion to allow use of the fellowship hall on the following dates: Wednesday, April 16, Jim Umerley memorial service; Saturday, April 26, Lena Gorman memorial service (Karen Biedronski); Sunday, May 4, Stansbury family baptism; Sunday, June 1, Marsheck graduation party. Joel McCrea seconded the motion; all approved.

Adjournment

Motion to adjourn was made by Michael Schumann and seconded by Andrea Zahirsky. The motion was carried, and the meeting was adjourned at 9:01 p.m. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.
