Dear Beloved Members of Christus Victor,

I feel that this Easter season has been marked with much grief. Our congregation has lost our beloved family members Joey Marsheck, Jim Umerley, Herb Crum, and Karen Biedronski's Aunt Lena (who had her memorial service here at Christus Victor). Perhaps you have recently lost a loved one also. We all know the intense heartache of grief.

Five decades ago, I lost my father, William Bernhard, a firefighter like Herb, in a warehouse fire right around Easter also. A fellow firefighter came up to me at the viewing and said (I remember his words verbatim), "It's hard losing your dad so young, and right around Easter, but remember that when Christ died, he died for William Bernhard, and he has raised Will to heaven, just as he ascended to heaven. He loves you so much little Ellen." It made me think of this Lenten and Easter season with such power and love.

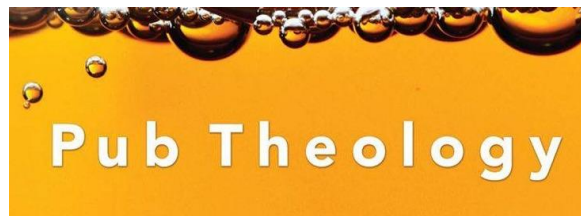

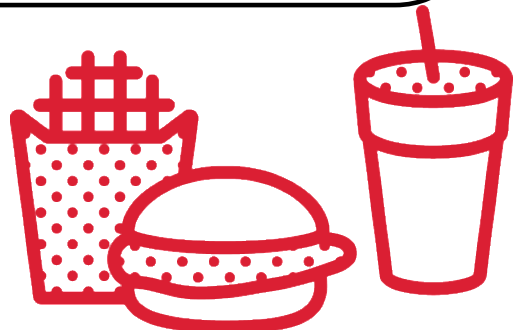

Council Minutes**

March 10, 2025

***Council meetings are open and everyone is invited to attend.
The agenda was planned by the Executive Team on March 9, 2025.***

Unite in Christ, Grow in Faith, Serve in Love, and Share the Good News

Attendance: Pastor Ellen Krich, Linda Meyer (President), Andrea Zahirsky (VP), Helen Tennant (Treasurer), Karen Biedronski (Secretary), Michael Schumann, Melissa Collins (Zoom), Kelly Ruby (Zoom), Sandy Petrovich (Zoom), Joel McCrea, Ugonnaya Obineme, Shelly Shrader, Phil Biedronski (Asset Account Manager, via Zoom).

Absent: Linda McMahon, Howard Stansbury

Call to Order at 7:06 pm Pastor Ellen Krich opened the meeting with a prayer.

CLAIM Presentation

Three representatives from CLAIM (Coalition of Lutherans Advancing in Mission), Pastor Don Egan, Jennifer Simms, and Bernie Penner, spoke about the goals of CLAIM and how Christus Victor being an active partner could benefit everyone. (Christus Victor has already participated by sharing our church to show The Chosen.) There is a suggested annual financial contribution of 0.5% of unrestricted giving, but how much we chose to give would be up to us. Karen Biedronski suggested using a portion of our Bequest Account to fund this.

Asset Account – Phil Biedronski

Phil Biedronski provided the Morgan Stanley Investment Account summary of activity for the month ending February 28, 2025. Our combined asset accounts grew by \$10,981 in February, and \$24,304 in total for January and February. Phil warned us that the numbers were not looking favorable so far for March.

Approval of Minutes

A motion to approve the February minutes was made by Helen Tennant and seconded by Andrea Zahirsky; the motion was passed. A copy of the minutes will be published in the next *Oakleaf*.

Status of Funds – Helen Tennant

- The February 2025 Profit and Loss report indicated that our income fell short of our expenses by \$1,825.30.
- The amount in the savings account, \$40,628.06, reflects the bequest from Elsie Peck's estate.

Pastor's Report

- "Noisy change" will be collected again this year to be taken to the annual Synod Assembly at the end of May. Will seek two volunteers from the congregation to represent Christus Victor at the Assembly in Westminster on Friday, May 30, and Saturday, May 31.
- September 7th is the Synod-wide Day of Service: God's Work Our Hands. If we can't do our project on that day, it is fine to chose another day.
- Pastor Don Keyser would like the church photo to be traditionally matted and framed.

Old Business

Outstanding Projects

- Painting: Nick Zahirsky will sand, prep and paint the altar room and touch up needed areas in the sanctuary and fellowship hall.
- Higher Standard Carpet Cleaning has been retained to strip and wax the fellowship hall floor, the hallway and classrooms. In addition, they will regrout the tile in the restrooms off the narthex. Total cost: \$4,000.
- Michael Schumann will take a formal headshot of Pastor Ellen to be framed and hung near the church office.

Tate's Send-off

Following the worship service on March 30, there will be a luncheon featuring Tate's favorite Italian foods as we wish him well during his 6-month deployment to the Middle East.

New Business

Administration

Tate Armstrong will continue choosing the music for our services and meeting with Worship and Music via Zoom during his 6-month absence. Michael Schumann recommends a partial salary of \$500 per month beginning June 1 after vacation pay has been used. This amount plus the estimated cost for substitute organists is about \$1,000 less than his current monthly salary.

Social Ministry

- A motion was made by Andrea Zahirsky and seconded by Melissa Collins to allow a co-ed AA group to use the fellowship hall every Saturday from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. The motion did not carry.
- A motion was made by Melissa Collins and seconded by Sandy Petrovich to allow the Baltimore Coin Club to use the fellowship hall on the first and third Thursdays of each month from 7 to 9 p.m. starting in July. Votes were in favor and the motion carried.
- Melissa Collins suggested we offer a date night child care service and/or babysitting and dog sitting to the community. Issues of liability and staffing were discussed.
- Melissa proposed church-branded merchandise to foster awareness. She will establish a committee and bring a proposal for how to do this most cost effectively

Survey Results

Karen Biedronski reported that there was good participation in the "Where We Get Our Information" survey. Almost 60 surveys were completed. The data collected revealed that the weekly bulletin was the most widely used source. Also, the PowerPoint shown on the overhead screen in the sanctuary was cited by many. Additionally, many people reported that they rely on verbal announcements before the service to find out what's going on. *The Oakleaf*, Facebook, and flyers posted throughout the church were other popular responses. The conclusion was that it is important to strive for consistency across all of the means of communication. Sandy Petrovich created a bookmark with church event dates that she suggested could be put in Victor's Vittles bags, pews, visitor gift bags and the fellowship hall, as well as shared at fellowship events. The bulletin board near the fellowship hall doors and the document holders on the wall could be used to place flyers for upcoming events.

Fundraiser Proposal

On behalf of the Youth Group, Andrea Zahirsky made a motion to allow a Wockenfuss candy sale to raise funds for activities. An assortment of boxed candy costs \$700 up front, and they will net \$400 if it is all sold. Joel McCrea seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.

CPR/AED Training

Sandy Petrovich made a motion for the church to pay for interested youth to take the CPR certification class on April 5. In exchange, they will take turns staffing the nursery during church services. Joel McCrea seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Joining CLAIM

It was decided to table the decision to join CLAIM until the next meeting.

Shrimp Feast

Joel McCrea proposed holding the annual shrimp feast on Saturday, May 17, from 2 to 5 p.m., and all were in agreement.

Mutual Ministry

Kelly Ruby reminded the council members to direct congregation members to the Mutual Ministry team when they have a concern. A Temple Talk is being planned for the near future. Karen Biedronski suggested creating a "business card" with team contact information that other council members could have to pass out as the need arises.

Adjournment

Motion to adjourn was made by Michael Schumann and seconded by Andrea Zahirsky. The motion was carried, and the meeting was adjourned at 9:39 p.m. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Reminder: Next council meeting is on Monday, April 14, 2025, at 7 p.m.
